An Update on Our Annual Appeal

Huge thanks to all who have participated thus far in our annual fundraising campaign! To date, we have raised a total of \$48,922.00!!! These funds came from 17 organizations and 209 private donors.

In comparison to last year's campaign, by the same time in November, we had raised \$46,968.00 from 23 organizations and 199 individuals. **We are happy to see we have raised about \$2,000 more and received gifts from 13 additional individuals.**

They will be providing over 260 flu vaccines for the farmworkers. We hope to continue these outreach visits and have a happy and healthy flu season.

A fun fact about one of the farms visited (picture above): the Foster farm in Middlebury produces about 1.5 million gallons of milk per year!
