OUTREACH IS WRAPPING UP FOR 2024

Every Wednesday, nurse Julia Doucet gathers her outreach team of volunteers, and helms ODC's exam van down the highways and byways of Addison County. In 2024, they'll make a total of 49 visits to 42 different farms, orchards, and other organizations and businesses. On arrival, the team sets up to provide vaccines, health screenings, and medical visits to all in need.

Outreach visits continue ODC's tradition of serving those on the farm, regardless of insurance status or cultural background. Our new exam van enables us to refer patients immediately to a provider for a medical consult, right there in the field. So far this season, we've provided 416 vaccines, seen 344 patients, and provided 61 on-farm medical appointments with a doctor or nurse practitioner. Says Julia, "We're so grateful to our wonderful, committed outreach volunteers, who come out with us in all weather to serve patients where they live and work!



STEWARDING COMMUNITY GIFTS

SHARING DESIRABLE FOOD

All the services at ODC are offered free of charge, but patients without ready access to transport may pay handsomely for a ride to the clinic and back home again. Recognizing this, and addressing the social determinants of health, we try to add value to each patient's visit, offering culturally desirable shelf-stable food and winter coats for arriving adults in our little free store, the *mercado*. Then, we connect people to our community partners, like HOPE and Junebug.

Previously, the shelves of the mercado were stocked with food contributed by an anonymous donor. When they were no longer able to assist, our cupboard became quite bare. Staff reaffirmed the mercado's value, and Director Heidi Sulis reached out to a Middlebury-based grantor, who made a \$5,000 gift to restock the shelves. Hearing of this story and gift, a longtime ODC friend and donor matched it!

Thrilled to be able to stock the shelves once again, we hope to make the funding last for a year. We're off to a good start and are heartened to see that the mercado continues to be well and regularly utilized. Patients are grateful for the opportunity to find a warm piece of clothing, set of gloves or a hat, and pick up some welcome and needed food.

APPRECIATING OUR VOLUNTEERS

ODC volunteers are an integral, daily presence: interpreting medical visits at both ODC clinics and in specialty practices, accompanying outreach, treating patients at our weekly clinics, or supporting our nurses with filing and data entry. Collectively, ODC volunteers contributed over 2,400 hours in 2023 and we're on pace to exceed that number this year! These hours are incredibly consequential: our dozen staff members comprise less than six full-time equivalents among us.

Hosted & supervised by Drs. Adam Fasoli & Peter Hopper at Middlebury Dental Group (MDG), residents like Christian have contributed over 110 hours of ODC patient care since July 2024. Their presence complements that of University of New England (UNE) dental externs at the site, expanding our capacity to meet patients' needs & deepening our long positive relationship with MDG. In the past 18 months, our program has been served by 5 UNE externs & 3 UVM residents.

Since volunteer coordinator Susannah McCandless joined ODC in April 2023, we've onboarded more than 50 new volunteers, who join a loyal cohort of more than 60 tenured volunteers. Our newest additions comprise at least 22 Spanish-English interpreters, 21 general volunteers, and 12 healthcare providers. And we're not stopping there! Twenty-five Middlebury students and community partner representatives participated in our fall volunteer training on November 9th, and a dozen have already applied to volunteer with us!

We celebrated our volunteers at American Flatbread Middlebury Hearth on November 14th with more than 40 volunteers and staff in attendance. We gathered to connect, have fun, and toast our talented volunteers with tasty local fare. A deep bow of gratitude to you! We couldn't do this critical work without you. We're so grateful for everyone's energy and care!
